General Observations

- What do you **notice**? (Describe <u>without</u> <u>judgment</u>: "I notice...")
- What is the **title** of the piece, who is the **composer**, and **performing ensemble**?
- Have you heard this piece before? YES/NO
- When do *you think* this piece was written?
- What **genre** would you classify this piece?
- Is the performance live or studio recorded?

Performance Style/Interpretation

- What **instruments** or **voices** do you hear in the listening example? How many?
- Is this an **original** work, a **cover**, or **inspired** by another work?
- When do *you think* this song was performed?
- How do the performers use breathing and phrasing to enhance the performance?
- How do the performer(s) movements and facial expressions contribute to the performance?

Musical Elements

- **Tempo** the speed of the music
- Dynamics different levels of volume, from soft (p) to loud (f)
- **Pitch** the way in which notes appear high or low in relation to one another
- **Rhythm** the length of certain notes, from short to long
- **Melody** the 'tune', created by combining rhythm and pitch
- **Harmony** when different pitches are played together at the same time to form chords
- Form the different sections in the song
- **Texture** the ways in which different lines of music interweave
- **Timbre** the sound qualities of different voices and instruments

Personal Response

- How does the music make you feel?
- What do you think the song is **about**?
- What **emotions** do you feel as you respond to this work?
- What does it **remind** you of? (What memory, experience, story, other music does this trigger? There are no wrong answers or associations.)
- Draw a scene or a design for which this is the soundtrack.
- What **questions** does it raise for you? ("I wonder...")

Music Vocab Terms

- A cappella singing without instrumental accompaniment
- Accelerando with increasing speed
- Accent An emphasis or "punch" at the beginning of a musical sound.
- Accompaniment a musical part that supports other parts
- **Beat/Pulse** Regular pattern within a bar or measure.
- Chord When two or more notes or pitches are sounded simultaneously a chord is created.
- Cadence a sequence of chords that brings an end to a phrase
- Crescendo Meaning growing, as in a swelling of sound, or becoming louder.
- **Decrescendo/Diminuendo** Getting softer; the opposite of crescendo.
- Harmony The simultaneous combination of pitches, especially when blended into chords that are
 pleasing to the ear.
- Ostinato a repeated phrase
- **Phrase** a musical sentence
- Song piece of music with words
